## The Difference

The difference between a technical person and a creative person?

A technical person favors an elaborate design with many parts, even though it does the job imperfectly. A technical person feels that when it does the job most of the time, it works. A creative person favors a simple intuitive design that does the job all the time, provided there's no outside interference that might destroy it. A creative in a technical position seeks the simplest solution and innovates, creates, changes, and comes up with original innovative designs. Creativity is key to progress and should be furthered on as many levels as possible.

Technical people function best kept out of responsible positions and shouldn't have to work, because otherwise they'll sabotage the work of others. This should be respected, because any pressure to get them to work causes obstinate rebellious destructive behavior.
